Sustainability and Legacy Grants Call: Track 2

Grants Information

The **overall objective** of Legacy Fund grants is to harness the unique contribution and strengths of small and grassroots organisations, by strengthening their capacity to bring about sustainable change in the lives of people with disabilities, including people with mental health conditions, particularly women with disabilities or mental health conditions

The **specific objectives** of Legacy Fund grants are:

To strengthen the institutional and technical capacity of small and grassroots SHGs, WROs and DPOs thus enabling them to play a greater role in user-led approaches to claiming the rights of people, especially women, with disabilities, including those with mental health conditions.

To improve the wellbeing of, and empower people, especially women, with disabilities, including with mental health conditions, through interventions implemented by small and grassroots SHGs, WROs and DPOs.

The total value of the Sustainability and Legacy Grants call is approximately Ghanaian Cedi (GHS) 1,700,000, subject to confirmation of funding from FCDO. It is anticipated that up to five grants will be awarded under Track 2, with up to 3 grants awarded under track 1. The final decision will be taken at the assessment and recommendation stage based on factors such as available total budget, quality of applications received, among others. Qualified Disabled People's Organisations (DPO) or Women's Rights Organisations (WRO) are eligible to apply for funding for one year for a maximum of GHS150,000 each.

Requirements of Expression of Interest

Applicants are expected to read the Call for Proposals in full. It contains critical information to support your application.

The EOI should be:

Eligible: Outline how you meet the eligibility criteria explained in the Call for Proposals

Strategic: Explain how you will respond to the grant objectives and the grant principles outlined in the Call for Proposals

Focused: Activities are related to a plan to create a change that will improve the wellbeing of people with disabilities or people with mental health conditions as well as a plan to strengthen the capacity of your organisation

Gender-aware: Applicants must show a commitment to advancing the rights of women with disabilities or mental health conditions, and the intervention must be women-rights centred or women-led, ensuring that interventions show that majority of participants will be women and girls (above 18 years of age).

Application process

All interested DPOs and WROs should submit an EOI of **no more than five pages** using size 12 font.

Applicants should submit their EOI via email to Grants@GhanaSomubi.com by 17:00 pm on 13th July 2022. Kindly note that no application will be considered after this date and time.

The Programme will assess proposals and invite a selection of applicants to work together with the capacity building partner to prepare a full application form, budget and results framework.
